## **Senate Budget & Fiscal Review Committee Agenda Released for February 2**

***Focus on Governor's Special Session Human Services Budget Cuts  
Including IHSS, SSI/SSP, CAPI, CalWORKS & Proposition 10***

SACRAMENTO, CALIF (CDCAN) [Updated 02/01/10 07:21 PM (Pacific Time)] The Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Committee, chaired by Sen. Denise Ducheny (Democrat – San Diego) released early this evening the 13 page agenda for the February 2<sup>nd</sup> hearing on the Governor's special session human services proposed budget cuts including major cuts proposed to In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS), to SSI/SSP grants for individuals, CalWORKS, CAPI (the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants), and reduction or fund shifting proposed for Proposition 10, the Children and Families Commission.

The Senate hearing is set for Tuesday afternoon, February 2, from 1:00 to 4:00 PM at the State Capitol in Room 4203.
